

# Supervisory Agreement for Doctoral Projects at the University of Wuppertal

This is a translation of the German agreement (as published in the Amtliche Mitteilung 50/24)

§ 1 Persons involved

### § 2 Responsibilities and Duties of the Doctoral Supervisor

The doctoral supervisor commits to conducting a detailed discussion with the doctoral candidate about the progress of the work (progress review) at regular intervals, at least every 12 months.

### § 3 Responsibilities and Duties of the Doctoral Candidate

The doctoral candidate will report to the doctoral supervisor during the progress reviews (at least every 12 months) on partial results and the status of the doctoral project.

§ 5 Acknowledgment of the Doctoral Degree Regulations
The signatories acknowledge the applicable doctoral degree regulations of the school in their current version. The doctoral procedure is conclusively governed by these regulations, particularly noting the adherence to the deadlines specified for the review of the dissertation.
§ 6 Duration of the Agreement
The doctoral supervisor and the doctoral candidate anticipate that the planned doctoral project (including the doctoral procedure) can be successfully completed
in years.

### § 7 Regulations for Conflict Situations

In cases of substantive and personal disagreements that significantly impair a trusting, constructive, and goal-oriented collaboration, and that seem irreconcilable to at least one of the involved parties, the Dean of the School will first be involved in attempting to find a solution. If the Dean is directly involved in the situation, the Deputy Dean will take their place. Reference is explicitly made to the advisory and complaint offices at the University of Wuppertal (BUW).

The supervisory agreement will end if no extension is agreed upon afterward.

#### § 8 Miscellaneous

The parties commit to adhering to the principles of good scientific practice as defined for the University of Wuppertal (BUW) in the regulations of August 10, 2022 (Official Announcement 57/22) or in their current version. The doctoral candidate is required to familiarize themselves with these rules.

In conflict situations, the ombudspersons for good scientific practice and, for further support, the doctoral advisory service of the Graduate Studies Center (ZGS) are available as points of contact.

Module 1: Project Plan
The doctoral project is outlined in a project plan dated

This project plan includes a content and timeline structure (annual milestones, key points) that specifies the start and planned submission of the work. The doctoral supervisor will support adherence to this schedule as much as possible. The project plan will be mutually updated regarding the development of scientific questions, possible qualification elements, and milestones. The doctoral candidate is responsible for maintaining the project plan.
Module 2: Discussion in the (International) Academic Community
The research results obtained during the doctoral project should be presented to the (international) academic community for discussion. This is usually done through publications subjected to a peer review process or through independent presentations at scientific conferences.
Module 3: Qualification Measures
Regardless of the requirements of the doctoral regulations, participation in the following qualification measures is agreed upon:
Participation in subject-specific and interdisciplinary qualification measures will be coordinated with the doctoral supervisor.

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Attention is drawn to the optional and interdisciplinary course offerings at BUW provided by the Service Center for Academic Staff Development (SAPE) and the Graduate Studies Center (ZGS) in areas such as leadership and responsibility, quality and ethics, teaching competencies, or scientific writing. Participation in

external offerings is also possible.
